Prizes

- Rosettes are awarded for 1st 2nd 3rd in all classes. We may award rosettes to 6th depending on entry numbers.
- Points are awarded for places 1 – 6 for all classes on the day, therefore the more classes you enter the more points you can earn. A **4 Strides** hi-point trophy will be awarded to the **club member** who accumulates the most points on the day.
- Points are awarded for all classes; members results are entered into a regional and national points system which are then accumulative over the season to qualify riders for annual awards.

HI-POINT TROPHY sponsored by 4 strides Equestrian UK LTD Will be awarded to the CLUB MEMBER who has achieved the most points overall for this show.

Entry Fees:

- **£4 per run** for 1 timed run. Time will be recorded and entered into the placings for points and/or rosettes. *(Ideal if you want to have a go in more than one class and pay as you go)*
- **£6 per "coached as you go" run** includes 2 coached practice runs and 1 timed run. Time will be recorded and entered into the placings for points and/or rosettes. *(Ideal if you missed the morning training clinic)*
- **£10 per 3 runs in one class**; no coaching, all runs timed, recorded and entered into the placings for points and/or rosettes.
- **To enter UKBHA classes it is £10 and a members only class.**

KEY RULES

- A barrel racing is a timed event using three identical barrels set in a cloverleaf pattern.
- A contestant will be given a “+100 seconds” for missing/going off the pattern.
- A contestant will be given a 5 second penalty for knocking over a barrel.
- Touching a barrel, including to keep it from falling, is permitted without penalty.
- A contestant will be given a “no time” if the horse or rider falls during the run in such a manner as to break the pattern, or if the rider falls off the horse.
- In UKBHA classes all 3 timed runs are added together to give an overall/average time, therefore you must do 3 runs in this class to be eligible for placing.
- In **4 Strides classes** only the fastest time counts.
- Contestants may ride any horse, regardless of ownership, and may ride as many horses as they choose in a class.
- A horse may not be shown by more than two people in a class.

Horses

Horses taking part in competition must be healthy and compete on their inherent merits. The use of a prohibited substance might influence the horse’s performance or mask an underlying health problem and could falsely affect the outcome of competition. If any Horse or competitor is found using prohibited substances, they will be subject to elimination from competition and also possible expulsion from the Association. Prohibited Substances are listed on the website of the BEF (British Equestrian Federation).

ATTIRE – Note this is encouraged and promoted but not essential

- To enhance the image of our sport, the UKBHA encourages and promotes appropriate western attire throughout all UKBHA approved events for both horse and rider. This includes a long-sleeved Western shirt with collar or Western motif. Shirt sleeves must be rolled down and buttoned or snapped. Shirt tails must be tucked in.
- In the interest of safety, contestants over the age of 18 are encouraged to wear appropriate riding safety helmets.
